# Origami Fabric Ornament Workshop


# **Supply List:**

- Cut two 8½ inch circles of contrasting Christmas themed fabrics prepared as shown below (see pattern p.2)
- Sewing needle and matching thread
- Scissors
- Thimble
- Pressing stick (and/or iron and pressing pad.)
- Embellishments ~ Beads and/or jewelry findings, fancy buttons, tassels, etc. If using small beads, you will also need a beading needle
- Ribbon, or gold or silver cording, at least 6" long
- Darning needle (I will bring mine, which you can use, if you don't have one)

## Bring your fabric prepared as described here:


- Sew the two 8.5 circles right sides together using a ¼ inch seam allowance. (Fig. 1)
- Notch the seam allowance or trim with a pinking sears. (Fig. 2)
- Determine which fabric will be the primary and which will be the accent color.
- Cut a 11/4 inch long slit just a bit off the center of the circle in the accent color only. (Fig. 3)
- Turn the fabrics right side out, carefully pulling the fabrics through the slit. (Fig. 4)
- Press flat using a point-turner tool to get a crisp edge, making sure that the seam edge stays true to a circle shape.
- If you wish to have help with the turning process, bring your circle (already stitched and trimmed) to the workshop.

#### CHRISTMAS HOBO BALL ORNAMENT

#### Supply List:

2-9-1/2" fabric squares (contrasting, but coordinated colors) 18" ribbon

1-1-1/2" Styrofoam ball OR batting OR cotton balls for center of ornament Embellishments (jingle bells, snowflake or other Christmas theme buttons, red miniature pom-poms for holly berries, miniature Christmas lights, wooden gingerbread men, felt ivy leaves with jewel centers, etc.)

### **Instructions**:

- 1. Determine which square to be inside. Cut 2" slit in center of square.
- 2. With right sides together, stitch ¼" seam around square. Trim corners.
- 3. Turn inside out through slit in center of inside square. Press.

Stop at this point, bring your sewn squares to class and finish your ornaments in class.

- 4. Put ball, batting or cotton balls in center of fabric, gather up fabric and tie ribbon around tightly and tie into bow.
- 5. Add embellishment: tie jingle bells around ribbon before tying into bow; glue holly berries to bow knot; glue miniature Christmas bells, snowmen, snowflakes, etc. to bow knot.
- 6. Also, top edges of the ornament could be embellished.

#### Comments:

- 1. Attach red, green, gold cord for hanging ornaments on tree.
- 2. Place on tree branches with no hangars.
- 3. Place on garland and set on/in branches.
- 4. Use as party favor with table setting.
- 5. Use scented potpourri as your center for a Christmas satchet.

#### Notes:

You can also make a nine patch, rail fence or other simple pattern for the outside square. Use coordinating fabric for inside. Since a lot of the outside fabric is gathered up, it's not easy to see the additional work.

# Quilted Look Ornament

# You will need:


3 fabrics-matching or coordinating Cut into:

Fabric 1 (center) 8-3"x3" squares
Fabric 2 (layer 2) 16-3"x3" squares
Fabric 3 (outer layer) 16-3"x3" squares
3"x12" strip

3" Styrofoam ball1 box Bridal & Lace pins per ornament

# Additional notions:

Scissors, thimble, hot glue gun, ceramic mug, and extension cord.
